

LOW COST SPAY NEUTER APPLICATION

Low Cost Spay Neuter Services are provided by local area veterinarians coordinated and facilitated by volunteers. To qualify for these services you will need to fill in the information requested and call 530-795-9545 for pricing for dogs or call 707-488-7123 for pricing and information about low cost spay neuter for cats.

The dogs are picked up in Fairfield and Vacaville and transported to the veterinarian's office in the morning and returned the same day. In Fairfield the dogs are picked up at 8:00 AM at the Solano County Animal Care parking lot 2510 Clay Bank Road Fairfield. The van leaves this location at 8:15 AM so it is imperative that you be on time. The Vacaville pick up is at the Petco parking lot on 210 Nut Tree Parkway Vacaville at 8:30. The van leaves this location at 8:45. The dogs are returned to Vacaville Petco parking lot at 5:00 PM and to the Solano County Animal Care parking lot at 5:30. Again this program can only operate if you are on time to drop off and pick up your dog. Friendly dogs on leash with fitted collar or in carrier.

Dogs must be at least 6 months old for this program. Early spay or neuter is not available at this time.

Upon receipt of your check we will call you and schedule your appointment. Appointments may be on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays depending on the availability of Volunteers.

Note: These appointments are precious; missed appointments will have a \$40.00 rescheduling fee.

Consent for Anesthesia and Surgery

I, Being of legal age and responsible for the animal described herein, have the authority to grant SCARF (Solano county Animal Rescue Foundation) and the Veterinary Clinic of their choice and it's volunteers or agents my consent to receive, transport, prescribe for, treat and / or perform surgery upon the animal named above.

I understand that modern techniques and trained staff will be used to care for the animals, and reasonable precautions will be used against injury, escape, or destruction of the animal. It is thoroughly understood Solano County Animal Rescue Foundation (SCARF) its agents, volunteers, the veterinary clinic and its staff will not be held liable or responsible in any manner and I assume all risks.

I understand that the risks of any surgical procedure including respiratory arrest, cardiac arrest, bleeding and infection. The risk of death from anesthesia and surgery is about 1 in 10,000. The professionally trained staff keeps this risk as small as possible.

I further understand that as long as, in the opinion of standing veterinarian, the animal is an acceptable surgical candidate, sterilization procedures will be performed regardless of the animals sex or medical condition (including pregnancy). I understand that the attending veterinarian can refuse to perform any procedure on any animal for any reason. Such refusal is to the sole discretion to the attending veterinarian.

I understand that all animals must be delivered and picked up for the designated location at the time designated on the same day as surgery. If I do not claim the animal at the designated time and place for the return, I will have abandoned the animal and I relinquish all ownership rights and I will be held responsible for any and all medical costs including surrender and boarding expenses and that Solano County Animal Rescue Foundation will take the animal to the Solano County Animal Shelter at 2510 Clay Bank Road and I can reclaim the animal form them during their normal business hours.

SPAY / Neuter Instructions

Pre Surgery:

No Food or water after 10:00 PM the night before surgery:

Post Spay Neuter Instructions:

Keep the dog as calm as you can for 5 to 7 days after surgery:

No suture removal is necessary.

DO NOT Allow your pet to lick the area of incision! An e-collar is provided to assist you with this. If the dog wants to lick the incision area keep the e-collar on for up to 7 days. The pet's damage to the wound may cause infection and or bleeding. The cost to treat conditions caused by licking is the responsibility of the pet owner.

DO NOT allow the incision to get wet from bathing or swimming for 2 weeks after the procedure.

Feeding post surgery: Give one fourth portion about 8: Pm or later, if the dog does not vomit, then another one fourth portion in ½ hour. That is all for day of procedure. Resume normal feeding next day.

Keep an eye on the incision. Should it become red, hot and or leak, this may be signs of an infection and your pet may require additional antibiotics.

Post surgery pain medications are not necessary and I do not recommended them for dogs under 2 ½ years old. Pain medications are available for an additional cost.
